



PRIMARY ELECTION RESULTS SUMMARY FOR IOSCO COUNTY AUGUST 2, 2022

Match Ups for the November General Election

There were 6,909 total votes across the County, resulting in a 29.94% voter turnout based on 23,076 eligible voters. Gov. Gretchen Whitmer received 2,108 votes compared to the Republican gubernatorial candidate Tudor Dixon, who garnered 1,395 votes or 20% of the Republican vote. A total of 4,292 Republican votes were cast in the county for Governor, which indicates 62% Republican compared to 31% Democratic votes.

The County Operating millage, which is needed to fully fund services including the jail, prosecuting attorney's office, and other critical safety services in the County, received support from East Tawas, Baldwin Township, and Tawas City. The remaining townships across the county all voted against the millage for a total of approximately 435 votes:
